The origin of this project is the requirements for the Stormwater Phase II mandate established by the EPA which necessitates that all MS4's - Municipal Separate Storm Sewer System operators that convey stormwater runoff to US Surface Waters must obtain a permit to do so. The requirements of the MS4 permit stipulate that all municipalities that qualify as an MS4 must have filed a Notice of Intent (NOI) by March 10, 2003, indicating their intention of developing and implementing a Stormwater Management Plan (SWMP) over 5 years (deadline - 3/10/2008) at which time the permit expires.

GPI reviewed and developed the Notice of Intent (NOI) for the Town of Hempstead in March 2003. The NOI required the Town to establish measurable goals for each of the six (6) minimum control measures required by the Phase II mandates. Conditions of the permit also stipulate that the Town must file an Annual Report by June 10th of each year documenting the progress made in the past year to prove to the NYSDEC that their SWMP is on track.

As part of the Town of Hempstead's on-going efforts to implement it's SWMP and comply with the conditions of the MS4 permit, GPI has been retained by the Town of Hempstead, Dept. of Engineering to prepare the Town's SWMP and Annual Report for 2003-2004.
